Independent Activities following retirement Greensboro, NC

- During 2010 - 2015, I taught a noncredit adult education evening course in landscape design and then became the instructor for a credit course in site planning at GTCC (in the architectural technology program) .
- In 2010 I worked for a period of months with a nonprofit group in the Raleigh-Durham NC area. This involved furnishing advice, concept assistance, and many of the digital graphics included in a proposal for a public park design, in response to an ad for a "virtual landscape architect."
- In 2008 and 2009, I spent a number of months searching satellite photo sources to find possible indications of church garden locations in Guilford and nearby counties, since there was no resource for these in existence. I followed the research with field visits to take photography of over 50 sites. - I had assorted responsibilities, mainly reviewing landscape planting plans and acting as the support person for activities of the Historic Preservation Commission. I had additional projects such as coordinating the original community meeting stages and consultant selection process for a master downtown streetscape renovation plan. I used MS Word for all written reports, and added the areas of photo retouch and web page layout to the printed media skills that I had from earlier experience. I successfully obtained tree planting and historic inventory grants, and coordinated preparation of a final manuscript for a recently published book on High Point's historic architectural resources. I was a member of the city's Urban Forestry Committee, which had responsibility for trees on public land in High Point.
- I prepared PowerPoint presentations using photography and hand sketches. I also communicated continuously with other departments and outside agencies. I continually dealt with the public, answering general questions and interpreting regulations and resolving problems. These were brought to my attention both by "walk in" and phone contacts.

- I was the owner of TerraTechnics (Landscape Architecture) located in the former McIver School on East Lee Street. I provided consultant services to churches, small businesses, and residential developers. My concentration was preparation of site plans for nonprofit group homes and multifamily "Section 8" housing with Clinton Gravely and Associates, architects. I prepared all of my own marketing portfolio materials, professional collaboration proposals, and I gave many slide presentations to garden clubs, newcomers clubs, and area builders' associations using my own photography of landscape plant materials and their applications in design. I retained my hand drawing and rendering skills throughout this period, after 1990 learning page layout for presentation graphics and CAD software centered on the Apple computer platform.
- I assisted as adjunct faculty for preparation of a new program in Landscape Architecture at A&T State University. The program eventually was granted approval to offer a full B.S. degree. At this stage our efforts centered on recruitment of students and preparation of basic course materials in landscape design. I developed a brochure, poster, and audio-visual presentation, and was sent out to explain the career by making scheduled visits to regional high schools (mostly to students in architectural drafting classes).
- Prior experience includes work in horticultural enterprises as a nursery salesperson, designer, and briefly as an agricultural research lab technician.
